Have you not known? Have you not heard? The LORD is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He does not faint or grow weary; his understanding is unsearchable. He gives power to the faint, and strengthens the powerless. Even youths will faint and be weary, and the young will fall exhausted; but those who wait for the LORD shall renew their strength, they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint.

Isaiah 40:28-31 (NRSV)

I recently participated in a Zoom meeting with two preacher/pastor/professor types from Duke Divinity School - Dr. Will Willimon and Dr. Richard Lischer. The meeting concerned the topic of preaching through Advent, definitely an interesting topic for 2020. During the meeting, Dr. Lischer said something which caught my attention. "Advent this year," he said, "is a very Isaiah Advent." Since hearing Dr. Lischer's comment I have done a little digging and come up with, what I think are, some reasons this is a "very Isaiah Advent."

To begin, many of the Old Testament readings for Sunday mornings through Advent come from the Book of Isaiah, especially from chapters forty on. This allows us to hear not only a prophetic voice, but a prophetic voice (and character) that many think of when they hear the word "prophet."

The other reason I think this will be a "very Isaiah Advent" has to do with the message of God proclaimed by the prophet. In the Book of Isaiah (especially chapters 40 on) the message of the prophet appears to shift from judgment to restoration. Restoration because Israel's exile will be coming to an end and God will restore them to their land and restore their relationship with God. As the prophet speaks of that reality the ideas of "waiting" and "hope" appear.

The idea of waiting (which is alluded to above in Isaiah 40) is more than just waiting on anything in general. The idea of waiting for the prophet is connected to waiting on God. And what an Advent theme waiting is, as we wait for the day to celebrate Christ's birth, and as we await Christ's return. But it is the theme of hope that seems to be so important for Isaiah. Again, not a hope in any generic thing, but a hope in God. And if there is a message we need to hear this season, it is the message of hope.

So as we celebrate the holidays for 2020 perhaps Dr. Lischer was right, this will be a very Isaiah Advent. Merry Christmas! Grace and Peace,

WMU-NC Red Box Inmate Christmas Ministry was due on November 2 to the JBA office. This year the item for collection was chapstick and our church collected 194 chapsticks. The JBA-WMU goal was 600 this year and we were successful in reaching that goal. Thanks to everyone who supported this project.

The **2020 Freda Parks Creech Woman of the Year award** was announced on Sunday, November 1 during the Heritage Day morning worship service. This year the award went to **Marilyn Parker.** Marilyn has served in many capacities in the church. She is secretary of the New Century Sunday School Class and the Dorothy Parker Sunday School class. She serves as assistant to the church secretary as needed. She has been instrumental in collecting items for the Samaritan Purse "Operation Christmas Child" shoeboxes for numerous years. She works with the Food Pantry every Thursday. In 2009 she began working with "Relay for Life" and Life Team – "Party of Tables." This is the teams largest fundraiser each year. She raised over \$61,000 and this year alone helped in raising over \$5,000. She has great sewing skills and sews on the award patches for the RA's as well as sewing covers for the changing tables. Her hobbies are traveling, and she likes to grow flowers starting with seeds – In fact, she grows plants and then gives them for gifts. So, she has planted many seeds in many ways!

In December/January, we will begin making plans for the **WMU Focus Day on February 28, 2021**. This year will be the 100th celebration of WMU-FO. We need old photos to make a video that will be shown during the morning service. Also, if you are interested in participating on the program during the Focus Day let Laura Rogers or Brenda Barnes know.
