Ecclesiastes 3:1

As we read the Book of Ecclesiastes, we realize the one who penned the book has seen a few things. We are not completely sure what all the individual has seen or experienced, but the writer knows enough to understand the complexity and blessing, joy and sorrow, of life. To be sure, all of these times are referred to as "a season." And it seems the writer believes that each of these "seasons" lasts for a period of time, and then another season begins.

As more and more people are being vaccinated and the deadly disruption of COVID-19 begins to recede (at least in the U.S.) with the regular routines of our daily lives beginning to return, I have been thinking about this passage (and others as well) in preparation for us to begin the next "season" of life together as FBC Four Oaks. As much as I would like for that to happen, I am not really sure it can - for a few reasons. (1) We all have changed. This is most evident in our children and youth whose physical growth amazes us when we see them, perhaps for the first time in a long time. (2) We have all been changed. I do not think I am the same "person" I was at the beginning of March 2020 - nor should I think that. A lot has happened over the last 15 months besides the pandemic; natural disasters, discussions of race, the role(s) of law enforcement, and a tumultuous election cycle just to name a few. And that does not take into account births & deaths, beginnings & endings, triumphs and failures. How have you changed?

So where does all this leave us? With only unanswerable questions about tomorrow? Well, again, I think this is where Ecclesiastes can once again help us not only with a description of the way the cycle of life unwinds, but with a word of encouragement that in looking "back" (realizing seasons have come before) we may actually find guidance on how to navigate the "future." ### **COVID-19 Update**

I wanted to update you on some changes that will take place on <u>June 6</u> regarding worship and the church's COVID-19 protocol we have been following over the last several months.

- 1. We will gather together for worship in the sanctuary.
- 2. There will be a section of the pews cordoned off for those who feel more comfortable to continue to socially distance.
- 3. We will no longer screen individuals as they enter the church.
- 4. If you are ill, we ask that you join us for worship online rather than in-person.
- 5. If you have been vaccinated, masks are optional. If you have not been vaccinated, masks are recommended. (Masks and hand sanitizer will still be available as you enter the church).
- 6. Childcare workers (for Nursery and Sunday School) will either be vaccinated or asked to wear a mask.
- 7. All of the entrances/exits of the church will be open.

I also wanted to thank the church for every effort made in navigating the waters of worship and ministry over the past year. To say this season has been "unusual" would be an understatement. But the church has, with God's guidance and strength, weathered the storm and persevered. Thank you!
